


GOSPEL REFLECTION

When Jesus died on the cross, he died to save all people no matter who they were. My problem is when I see people behaving in a wicked manner or hear of them, I feel anger not only at what they are doing also at them. All too often I find myself saying "I hope they get what they deserve." Yet, Jesus says "Love one another as I have loved you." He showed His love by dying for me. I must, therefore, love these people in the same way that Jesus loves me. Although I must never condone evil as such I must try to see the perpetrators the way the Lord sees them. He wants them saved. He sees what they are doing to themselves. And will have compassion truly wanting their reconciliation. Perhaps He is relying on me to help Him. It is said that St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) seeing a female guard flog a prisoner in Auschwitz was heard saying "poor, poor thing." Someone agreed, saying the prisoner must be really suffering. St Teresa then said "No I mean the Guard." God bless. Fr Pat
