
GOSPEL REFLECTION

THE CANONIZATION OF TWO YOUNG SAINTS BY POPE LEO IN ROME ON 7 SEPTEMBER



Pier Giorgio Frassati Carlo Acutis

The canonization of Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati is a historic event that will take place on September 7, 2025. This event will be held in St. Peter's Square in Rome, marking the first time a millennial saint will be canonized.

The canonization process for Carlo Acutis began shortly after his death in



2006, and it has been a significant journey for the young man from Italy. The relics of Pier Giorgio Frassati will be transferred to Rome for veneration before the canonization ceremony.

The Holy Father announced that Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis will be canonized together on 7 September.

The canonizations of the two young saints—one from the early twentieth century, the other the first twenty-first-century saint—have been greatly anticipated due to the great devotion among the faithful. The late Pope himself had announced the canonizations of Blessed Pier Giorgio and Carlo at the General Audience of 20 November 2024, prompting thunderous applause from the crowds gathered in St. Peter's Square.

Pope Leo, made the choice to enrol among the number of the saints, two young men from different eras who led completely different lives, but who are nonetheless united in their love for Christ and their ability to impart that love to those whose lives they touched.
