GOSPEL REFLECTION

For me, the last sentence in today's Gospel is one of the most frightening in the scriptures. "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

In the first part of the Gospel the Lord is contrasting the corrupt judge to God. If the widow can untimely succeed in getting the judge to listen to her, how much more will God, who loves us,

respond to our prayer? The widow was desperate and would not accept "no" for an answer, she knew exactly what she wanted.

Yet, how often have I prayed to God, knowing clearly what I wanted or thought I needed but did not get it, even though I had prayed and prayed? However, God is God and He sees the whole of time including what will happen to me. Surely this is the greatest irony. I may be convinced that if the Lord really loved me how an he not answer my prayer, no matter how desperate. Yet, precisely because he loves me that he doesn't. That is why after every prayer, no matter how much I want it answered I must say "Thy will be done". Is my faith strong enough to accept that and never give up? God bless. Father Pat
