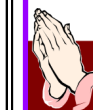

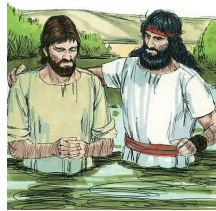
THE ARCHBISHOP'S VISIT

GOSPEL REFLECTION: THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

John's baptism is a baptism of repentance. Jesus being without sin did not need to be baptised. He chose to be baptised in order to show His



oneness and solidarity with sinful mankind. So even right at the beginning of His Ministry, when He hears His Father's voice and is anointed with the Holy Spirit, He shows His love for the human race. As we begin a New Year let us remember that we are not being asked merely to follow a set of commandments and rules but to respond in love to His love for us. He not only wishes us to



follow Him in our lives but to share our lives with Him including our faults and failures. All too often we leave these outside our relationship and prayer with Jesus because they cause us embarrassment and shame. However, they are part of who we are. Unless we allow the light of His love to illuminate them how can He help and heal us. He was baptised in order to identify Himself with us. If He had not been baptised He would have done the thing right, but would He have done the right thing? Is my relationship with the Lord like that? I try to be good and not do anything wrong because that's what God expects me to do, or do I do the right thing? I obey His will because I love Him as I know He loves me. What do we need to be afraid of?
